Entry Requirements

This course has the following entry requirements:
International students must:

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Have an IELTS score of 5.5 or equivalent (test results must be no more than 2 years old) with 5.0 in each band
- Have completed a Year 12 or equivalent high school certificate

Candidates will also be required to complete a pre-enrolment Candidate Self-Assessment as part of the application and participate in a course entry interview to determine suitability for the course.

Course Duration

Two (2) year full time

Total Duration: 104 Weeks (including holidays and breaks)

Contact (delivery) Weeks: 80 Weeks

This course will be delivered over a period of 104 weeks (including holidays). Classes will be scheduled for 80 weeks over 8 academic terms of 10 weeks each. There will be a 2-week break between the terms and a 6-week Christmas holiday end of the year.
